CHANGED CONDITIONS FOR CYCLISTS ON THE SYDNEY HARBOUR BRIDGE

Cyclists are advised of changed conditions on the Sydney Harbour Bridge bike path from Monday 21 November due to continuing resurfacing work.

A Roads and Maritime Services (RMS) spokesperson said the resurfacing work is being carried out in two stages to ensure cyclists can continue to use the link between the North Shore and Sydney CBD and no complete closures are planned.

“Stage one of work, which was recently completed, involved sealing a 20 metre trial section of the bike path with a new hard-wearing bike path surface,” the spokesperson said.

“Stage two, which starts on Monday, involves resurfacing and sealing a larger 270 metre section of the bike path.

“This is scheduled to be completed by mid January 2012, weather permitting.

“To ensure the safety of cyclists and workers and to allow the resurfaced area to dry, affected sections of the bike path will be temporarily narrowed to half their normal width until the work is completed.”

Cyclists need to be vigilant while the work is carried out and follow signs.

Avoid overtaking if necessary, be alert to pedestrians, and be aware of any change in bike handling conditions due to the new riding surface.
